California's Reimbursement Requirement

- Idea Makes Intuitive Sense
- Sorting Out Which State Requirements Must Be Reimbursed Can Be Tricky

"Whenever the Legislature or any state agency mandates a new program or higher level of service on any local government, the state shall provide a subvention of funds.."

ARTICLE XIII B, Section 6

Is this a Reimbursable Mandate?





- Was Freely Imposed by State Government Upon Local Agencies

Requires Local Agencies to Pay for New Governmental Program, Higher Level of Service, or Cost Share for a State-Local Program

- Created before 1975
- Enacted upon local agency request
- Defines a crime or penalty
- Establishes voluntary provision—or requirement for voluntary program
- Possible to pay with fees, offsetting savings, or designated state funds
- Imposed upon a type of agency that did not levy a property tax
- Established to implement a voter/federal requirement



No, Not a Reimbursable Mandate

- Voter Approved
 Measures Are Not
 Requirements "Freely
 Imposed" by State
 Government
- Measures Defining a Crime Are Not Reimbursable Mandates



People Released From Jail for Orange Hair Crimes

- Counties Must Provide Counseling Services
- Would This Be a Reimbursable Mandate?



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Yes, a Reimbursable Mandate

- All Costs to Run Counseling Program Reimbursable
- All 58 Counties





Graffiti Bill

- Cities Must Continue Existing Programs
- And Increase Funding For Inflation
- Is This a Reimbursable Mandate?





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Yes, a Reimbursable Mandate

- Reimbursable Costs Include Baseline Program Costs
- And Inflation Adjustment





Elementary School Goldfish



- Schools Must Keep Goldfish in Classrooms
- All Major School Districts Sent Letters of Support for Pending Legislation



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
Local Request Exemption

- All Affected Local Agencies Must Pass Resolution Requesting Requirement
- Simple "Letter Of Support" Not Enough
- Requirement a Reimbursable Mandate on any Agency Not Passing Resolution



Yes, an Reimbursable Mandate

- Agencies Did Not Pass Resolution Requesting Requirement
- Mandate on all School Districts
- Reimbursable Costs
 - Fish, Tanks, Fish Food,
 - Perhaps Facility Modifications, Teacher Training . . .





Bus Tire Tread



- Congress Passes Law Placing State
 Transportation Funding at Risk
- States Must Ensure All Buses Maintain Minimum Tire Tread
- School Districts Have Increased Costs



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 Higher Level of Service, or Cost Share for a State-Local Program

Did Not Meet Either Threshold Criteria. No Need to Review Exemptions Exemptions

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No, Not an Reimbursable Mandate

- Not "Freely Imposed by State"
- Not a Governmental Program—
 Applies Equally to Private Sector
- Carries Out Federal Requirement





Meter Water





- State Law RequiresWater Districts to UseCertain Type of Meter
- Governing Board
 - Can Recover Costs
 Through Fees
 - But Don't Want To



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No, Not a Reimbursable Mandate

- If Local Agency Can Offset Costs With Fees
 - But Fee Revenues Must Be Realistic





Property Tax Shift



- **County Auditors Must Reallocate Property Taxes**
- **Schools Get More Money**
- Other Local Agencies Get Less



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Yes, Small Part of Measure Is a Reimbursable Mandate

- Revenue Losses Are Not Mandates
- Sometimes, Only a Small Administrative Requirement Is a Reimbursable Mandate
- Minor Administrative Costs Are a Reimbursable Mandate



Safer Clothing for State and Local Firefighters

 State Agency Regulation Requires Fire Departments to Provide Safer Clothes to Fire Fighters





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Yes, a Reimbursable Mandate

Marginal Costs to Buy Safer Clothes Is Reimbursable





Worth Noting

- Sometimes State Policy Can Be Drafted to Yield Similar Outcomes Without Imposing a Reimbursable Mandate
 - Requiring "Safe Clothing" for All Employees In Dangerous Occupations
 - Not a Reimbursable Mandate



Ozone Limitations Plans



- Federal Law RequiresPlans
- State Law Adds
 Required Elements to

 Federal Planning Law



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Yes, a Reimbursable Mandate



- Marginal Cost to Comply With State Requirements Are Reimbursable
- What About Costs to Carry Out Plan?
- If State Law Directed Local Agencies to Implement Plan, Costs to Carry Out State Required Element Would Be Reimbursable



Property Tax Administration



- Counties May Charge Redevelopment Agencies Fees to Offset Costs
- Is this a Reimbursable Mandate?



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No, Not a Reimbursable Mandate

- No New Program
 - Reallocating Responsibilities of Local Governments
- Redevelopment Agencies Not Eligible





Bike And Shade Tree (BAST) Program

- Free Bikes and Trees
- State Funds Half of Program's Costs For 12 Years
- Law Deletes BAST
 Funding and Says Cities
 Are Responsible for All
 Costs



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A Transfer of Financial Responsibility Could Be a Reimbursable Mandate, If . . .

- Shift Is By Legislature Not Governor Or State Agency
- To City, County, Or Special District
 Not Schools Or Community Colleges
- Required Program
 Something Local Agencies Must Implement
- Previous State Responsibility
 Look For Pre-existing Statutes Assigning Responsibility

No, Not a Reimbursable Mandate

Because State Never Assumed Financial Responsibility





Was Freely Imposed by State Government Upon Local Agencies



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Subsequent BAST Legislation

- Goals of Program Not Being Realized
- Legislature Passes Law Requiring More Expensive Trees and Bikes
- Requirements Not Mentioned in Measure Approved by Voter







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Subsequent BAST Measure Not a Reimbursable Mandate

Because Legislature Simply Trying to Carry Out Wishes of Voters
