

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K-12 Proposition 98 Funding Per Pupil





After Reductions During Recession, Funding Begins to Increase in 2012-13



Funding in Governor's 2015-16 Budget Slightly Above Inflation-Adjusted 2007-08 Levels



California Per-Pupil Ranking Compared to Other States



California's Ranking in Per-Pupil Spending Decreased During Recession

- In 2007-08, California ranked 23rd among 50 states and District of Columbia.
- In 2011-12, California ranked 36th.
- Given funding increases over the last three years, California's ranking is likely to increase as data are updated.




California's Ranking Drops if Adjusted for Cost of Employment

 Some rankings adjust per-pupil spending based on regional variation in wages. In one recent wage-adjusted ranking, California ranks 45th in the nation.

Project Average Annual Growth of 3.3 Percent From 2014-15 to 2019-20



Project Faster Growth in First Few Years

- Minimum guarantee increases 8.1 percent from 2013-14 to 2014-15.
- Minimum guarantee increases 4.1 percent from 2014-15 to 2015-16.



LAO Main Proposition 98 Forecast (Continued)



Project Slower Growth in Guarantee as Proposition 30 Revenues Phase Out

- Sales tax increases phase out over 2016-17 and 2017-18.
- Personal income tax increases phase out over 2018-19 and 2019-20.
