

- Consider Placing Greater Requirements for Planning
- Consider Other Targeted Reductions



Major Early Education Proposals

- Reimbursement Rate Decreases (-\$463 Million)
- State Preschool Slots Reductions (-\$289 Million)
- > Rescinding of Previous Initiatives (-\$263 Million)
- Modified Reorganization Proposal (\$2 Million)



Early Education Federal Funding Increases

≻Ongoing

• Alternative Payment vouchers (\$53 million).

> One Time

- Current-year COVID-19 costs (\$152 million).
- Stipends for subsidized providers (\$125 million).
- Temporary vouchers (\$73 million).

Plan Does Not Assume Emergency Orders Continue

- Consider Options to Minimize or Mitigate Effects of Rate Reductions
- Continue to Have Concerns With Reorganization Proposal



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
