




# California's Population Has Increased Dramatically Over Time


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California's Civilian Population




# California Is Becoming Increasingly Urban

Population Density per Square Mile




# Changes in the Mix of State Expenditures Over Time




# Local Funds Account for Half of Transportation Revenues

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1999-00






# Distribution of TCRP by Region

# TCRP Changes

## 2001-02 May Revision

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- ▶ **Postpone sales tax transfer for two years**
  - \$2.3 billion
- ▶ **Loan to General Fund—\$238 million**
- ▶ **Meet cash flow needs of TCRP projects**
  - SHA, PTA, MVA
- ▶ **Meet local street and roads commitment**
  - SHA



# Implications of TCRP Changes

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- ▶ **Sales tax transfers begin in 2003-04**
- ▶ **Extends program for two years**
  - until 2007-08
- ▶ **STA receives \$38 million less in 2001-02**
- ▶ **Potential negative impact on delivery of STIP/SHOPP**
- ▶ **No uncommitted PTA funds for two years**
