*Mandate Costs.* The State Constitution generally requires the state to pay every mandate's post-2003 bills in the annual budget, or suspend or repeal the mandate. Last month, the State Controller reported that the state owes counties \$133 million for AB 3632 mandate claims for activities conducted between 2003 and 2008.

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### **Initial Concerns About Administration's Proposal**

- Suspending AB 3632 mandate would be temporary, confusing, and disruptive.
- Eliminating AB 3632 funding could violate federal special education spending requirements.
- Proposal does not address transitional issues associated with change.
